Prenatal and Prenatal Plus: Through the state's Prenatal Program, Title V supports the provision of prenatal care and enhanced services to pregnant women in Colorado whose citizenship is undocumented. Through the Prenatal Plus Program, Title V provides enhanced services to all pregnant women receiving Medicaid who are considered at high risk for low birth weight. These services address psychosocial, lifestyle, and nonmedical aspects of women's lives likely to affect pregnancy, and are successful in reducing expected low birth weight rates by up to one-third. The Health Care Program for Children with Special Needs discontinued its specialty medical benefits program in July 2003. The dollars for this program were redirected to regional programs and county nursing agencies for increased enabling and population based services. All counties in the state now provide information, consultation and parent-to-parent support to families who have children with special health care needs. As much as possible, the children with special health care needs contractors meet with other systems and providers and families to improve the delivery of services and support. Child Health Plan Plus: Colorado's CHIP, Child Health Plan Plus, was approved and begun in April 1998, and offers low-cost insurance coverage to 54,000 children. A dental benefit was added to the plan beginning in 2002.

b. Population-Based Services:  
*(max 2500 characters)*

Newborn Hearing Screening: Colorado has been a national leader in the provision of newborn hearing screening in the hospital prior to discharge. In 2003 a documented 96.2 percent of all newborns were screened. Intervention for infants with hearing problems begins very early in life, with improved outcomes for these children. Genetics: Colorado's system of newborn screening and tracking shows 97.5 percent of all births being appropriately screened for 6 diseases (phenylketonuria, congenital hypothyroidism, galactosemia, sickle cell disease, biotinidase deficiency, and cystic fibrosis). One new test was added in July 2000, Congenital Adrenal Hyperplasia (CAH). A low birth weight report, Tipping the Scales: Weighing in on Solutions to Colorado's Low Birth Weight Problem, was released in September 2000. This report quantifies the number of LBW births due to multiple gestation, inadequate weight gain, smoking, and premature rupture of the membranes. These modifiable risks contribute the greatest number of LBW births out of all causes. The report is available at [www.cdphe.state.co.us/ps/mchadmin/tippingthescales.pdf](http://www.cdphe.state.co.us/ps/mchadmin/tippingthescales.pdf). A statewide effort to modify physician practices was begun in 2002, and a social marketing campaign to inform consumers about inadequate weight gain in particular was launched in 2004. These efforts are part of a long-term strategy to reduce the state's high low birth weight rate.

Data profiles are provided for each county, and county comparisons are provided on each national and state performance measure with reference to the Healthy People 2010 targets. Maps are also available. Data Systems: The IRIS system (Integrated Registration and Information System) allows unduplicated counts of patients among a variety of programs. In addition, the EHD (Early Hearing Detection and Intervention) program is developing a database of all newborn screening results. Program Integration: Legislation was passed in 2000 to improve the health and well-being of Colorado's children and youth by coordinating programs at the state level. During FY 00 and FY 01, a number of programs were relocated to the state health department from other state agencies. The MCH administration is located in the same division as these other programs, and works closely with many child and youth programs that are focused on the prevention of problems from an early age. State budget cutbacks in 2002 and 2003, however, have reduced the size of these programs a great deal. In 2002 the national State and Local Area Integrated Telephone Survey (SLAITS) completed a survey for children with special health care needs. This survey produced valuable state-level data for

planning for children with special health care needs.

Over 6 percent of all WIC children age 0-5 in Colorado are obese. This proportion increased during the 1990's and the problem is apparently growing. The Healthy People 2010 goal is to limit this proportion to 5 percent.

Birth weights have improved significantly among women served by the program known as Prenatal Plus, which is funded through Medicaid. The program has the potential to serve 10 to 15 percent of all births in the state, and to serve a far higher proportion of high-risk women most in need of risk reduction.
