Case management and specialty referral ensure that children with complex health and psycho-social needs have access to multi-disciplinary, coordinated evaluation and treatment from specialists in tertiary Pediatric Special Care Centers.

Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) Program: Coordinates SIDS services through data collection and analysis, support services to families and child care providers, education and training for parents, coroners, nurses, first responders and child care providers, conducts the Back to Sleep campaign. Breastfeeding Strategic Plan defines specific activities to be carried out by the MCH and CMS Branches in coordination with MCH programs like AFLP and BIH and State and local agencies such as WIC. Childhood Injury Prevention Program: promotes public awareness of the preventable nature of injuries, develops coalitions at the local, State, and regional levels, and provides technical assistance to State and local programs. Birth Defects Monitoring Program: Collects and analyzes data on children with birth defects. Newborn Genetic Screening and Expanded Alpha Fetoprotein Programs: Screens for congenital primary hypothyroidism, galactosemia, phenylketonuria, and sickle cell disease and other hemoglobinopathies. Offers prenatal screening to detect neural tube defects and other fetal abnormalities. Newborn Hearing Screening Program: A statewide hearing screening program for all infants born in CCS-approved hospitals has been implemented.

c. Infrastructure Building Services:

Local MCH Programs: The MCH Branch contracts with 58 counties and 3 city health jurisdictions to support the infrastructure at local health departments to promote the health and well being of all women of childbearing age, infants, children, and adolescents. Services include a toll-free telephone system; perinatal outreach and education; perinatal provider networks; monitoring and public education on children's issues, including injury and family violence prevention, and data collection. Fetal Infant Mortality Review Program: There are 17 FIMR projects that cover 17 counties in California where communities have set up a standardized infant death review system to identify, evaluate, and determine potential factors that contribute to preventable infant death. Development of CMS Net: The CMS Branch continues implementation of an integrated statewide data system, CMS Net. This case management system is allowing tracking of health services and outcomes for CSHCN, monitoring quality standards, and providing a basis for policy development. Linkage of this system with other State data systems is in progress and will improve management and epidemiologic capabilities.
